#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

My love of *Hedda Gabler* and, indeed, all of Henrik Ibsen's plays began many years ago when I first read Hedda as an undergraduate acting student. The play and the complexities of its title character fascinated me. Why does she do what she does? What could cause such cruelty and such despair? I have long felt that, were I a woman, Hedda is the character I would most dearly love to play. She is for me what many actors feel when they think of King Lear or Lady Macbeth, Othello or Blanche DuBois.

From *Hedda*, I went on to read several other Ibsen plays, then on to Michael Meyer's incredible three volume biography of Ibsen, then on to yet more plays and critical analysis of the plays, and, finally, I had the great fortune to perform in a couple of his plays. My journey with Ibsen and his magnificent body of work has been a long one and with each step, my fascination and admiration has grown ever deeper.

In addition to his biography, Michael Meyer also happens to be a translator of many of Ibsen's plays including the translation of tonight's play. Meyer has described Hedda Gabler, as a "portrait of the dramatist as a young woman." So much of Hedda is drawn from Ibsen's own emotional world and experiences that one could confidently say she is one of his most personal creations.

Hedda's frustration, anger, and despair come about for a multitude of reasons, and the play carefully reveals her conflicts layer by layer. *Hedda Gabler*, like many of lbsen's plays, explores the importance of leading a life fulfilled. He especially focuses on the opportunities provided or denied to women. What happens when social forces deny an individual control over her own destiny, over her own body? Hedda's world, life, and experience may seem far removed from ours today, but if we stop to ponder her plight, is it really?
