

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

for The Tragedy of King Richard the Third

- -Two factions fighting against each other for control of the country
- -Families divided over politics
- -The fear of another civil war
- -Leaders holding bibles in front of churches to gain trust
- -The spread of false rumors to slander the opposing side
- -Former allies jailed and killed
- -Marriages of convenience and power
- -Men rule the world
- -Women's power held in check

No, this is not today's headlines. It's the plot of *Richard III* taken directly from the script written over 400 years ago. It's amazing just how much of this play mirrors current events and the temperature of our country. Like most storytellers, Shakespeare bends the facts to give us a dynamic cast of characters, fun plot twists, nail-biting intrigue, and medieval battles. In the midst of the fun, he also astutely schools civilians on being vigilant to lies and corruption.

It's also astounding that Shakespeare understood that women were silenced with their voices taken from them in the male arenas of power. They compensated with the power to lament, keen, cry, and curse and they did so with action and with purpose. In the funeral procession through London with the corpse of her father-in-law Henry VI, Anne says, "Set down your honorable load....whilst I awhile obsequiously lament the untimely fall of virtuous Lancaster." Shakespeare lifts up these women's voices and lets them fly.

The story of the last English king to die in battle is made even more interesting by the discovery in 2012 of RIII's skeleton under a parking garage. The cast and creative team have delved into script analysis, rhetoric, music, history, lamentation workshops, and sword training. I could go on and on about the academics of this history play, but.... it's a play. Watch it and make up your own mind. It's been a blast to put together.

Many thanks to guest artist Marya Lowry for her incredible extended voice lamentation workshop. To Lee Soroko for choreographing the battles with me and guiding the cast in safe stage combat practices. To Caryl Fantel for coaching the singing. To Ben Lowe for showing such enthusiasm for the play. For the design and technical team who have invigorated this process with talent, professionalism and passion. To the faculty of the Department of Theatre and Dance who remain staunch supporters of each other while we continue to "into a thousand parts divide one man" to get the job done. And last but not least, to the cast, assistant director, and stage managers who start at 9am with a full day of classes and homework, and show up passionate and ready to work hard from 7-11pm every damn night for 6 weeks.




