

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Neil Simon's successes as a master humorist and gifted comic writer had been well-established since the 1950's with his four Emmy nominations for his work in Television, most notedly in the *Show of Shows* and the *Caesar Hour*. However, he left TV behind and throughout the 1960's and 70's wrote one Broadway hit after another starting with *Barefoot in the Park*, *The Odd Couple* (Tony), *Sweet Charity*, and *The Star-Spangled Girl* to name just a few of his many crowd-pleasing plays. At one point in his career, Simon had FOUR plays running simultaneously on Broadway, and given his sustained productivity earned a special Tony for his contribution to Broadway in 1978. Over the course of his writing career, he has earned a total of 14 Tony awards including a Pulitzer Prize for *Lost in Yonkers* and the coveted Mark Twain Prize for American Humor in 2006.

Prior to *Brighton Beach Memoirs*, Simon's plays were either comedies or dramas and his attempts to combine the two, were not well received by audiences or the critics. This changed on March 27, 1983, when *Brighton Beach Memoirs* opened at the Alvin Theatre and with it, he changed the landscape of the American Theatre. In this play he was able to successfully accomplish his longtime goal of melding comedy within the structure of the drama. This play's success ushered in a new way of writing for Simon going forward and with this change in style he earned a new cavalcade of honors and critical acclaim for his work. *Brighton Beach Memoirs* paved the way to a trilogy of award-winning plays (and film adaptations) with his semi-autobiographical protagonist Eugene Jerome at its center in *Biloxi Blues* and *Broadway Bound*. Furthermore, the Alvin Theatre, where this play made its debut changed its name to the Neil Simon Theatre, making him the only living playwright to have a New York theatre named in his honor.

At its surface this is a coming-of-age story, but true to Simon's form the play is much more than that. I hope that you sit back, relax, and enjoy this awardwinning work as it touches your heart and funny bone.






