DIRECTOR'S NOTE

"I'm not a human rights activist, I'm not a lawyer, I'm not a journalist. But what I can do — that many of them won't do — is that I can listen to your story from beginning to end, and I'll do it with patience, and I'll do it with compassion." - Lynn Nottage

Lynn Nottage is the first and only woman to win the Pulitzer Prize for Drama twice, for her plays *Sweat* and *Ruined*. According to American Theatre magazine, one of her plays (the comedy *Clyde's*) will be the most-produced play in the U.S. this season. Presenting *Sweat* as part of our mainstage season gives our students a chance to perform a work by a playwright they will encounter frequently (I hope) as they move on to their professional careers.

Sweat arose from a commission by the Oregon Shakespeare Festival to write a play addressing a topic in American history. Nottage chose to address the condition of American steelworkers in 2000 after The North American Trade Agreement (NAFTA) sent much of their work to Mexico. Nottage and her team of student assistants spent two years conducting interviews with affected workers in Reading, Pennsylvania, named the poorest City in the U.S. by the New York Times in 2011. In Sweat, she gives us insight into how a group of these workers handle their fears as they watch their livelihoods erode under circumstances over which they have no control.

As we analyzed the script, the cast and I marveled at Nottage's craftsmanship and her nuanced approach to the themes in the play. Raised by socially conscious parents active in the Civil Rights Movement, Nottage often explores the plight of the marginalized in society. Her ability to address issues in a subtle manner -- while giving us an engaging plot with multi-dimensional characters — showcases a playwright at the top of her game. The process has been a valuable exercise in empathy as the cast walks in the shoes of those who have fallen on hard times through no fault of their own.
