


March 29 - April 14



HOW TO GET HERE

From interstate 95: traveling east on Glades Road, continue past the main campus entrance at 10th Avenue to the secondary campus entrance at NW 13th Street. Turn left at the traffic light on NW 13th Street. (Once on campus it is called E. University Drive). Take the second left at Arts Avenue. Continue on Arts Avenue to Parking Garage 2 on the south side. Park and exit the garage to the west, walk south along the sidewalk to the patio with the red columns, where you will see the entrance to Theatre Lab.

Theatre Lab patrons MUST park in Parking Garage 2. Parking elswhere may result in being ticketed.
