Rod Faulds combines similar photographic images of ordinary subjects, such as construction dividers or painted highway lane markers, piecing them together to achieve line-blurring results. His work operates in the margin between photography and painting. After a long career as a museum administrator and educator, in 2010 Faulds began making art after a thirty-year hiatus. Since 2014 he has exhibited his work at the Hollywood Art and Culture Center (solo exhibition), the Cultural Council of Palm Beach County, and the Art Gallery at the Palm Beach Gardens Campus of Palm Beach State College.
