Edouard Duval-Carrié (born 1954) is a Haitian-born American painter and sculptor. Born in Port-au-Prince, his family emigrated to Puerto Rico while he was a child during the François Duvalier regime.

Duval-Carrié studied at the *Université de Montreal* and McGill University in Canada before graduating with a Bachelor of Arts from Loyola College, Montréal in 1978. He later attended the *École Nationale Supérieure des Beaux-Arts* in Paris, France, from 1988 to 1989. He resided in France for many years and currently lives and works in Miami, Florida. Today he is one of the most recognized contemporary visual artists from the Caribbean in America.
