BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Dr. James Capp, associate vice president for strategic planning and student success, will provide an update on the live, in-progress status of key student success measurements, including freshmen retention and the timely graduation rates of various cohorts. In addition, Dr. Capp will provide the Board with a current overview of Florida Atlantic's broad student success strategy with a focus on the work of the University's cross-functional teams and their AI-driven predictive analytics platforms. Lastly, Trustees will review ongoing initiatives that are having transformational impacts on academic operations and FAU students, such as recently implemented technology, a nimble and comprehensive financial aid strategy, innovative academic support services, and efforts to reinvent the classroom experience. This presentation will offer the Board a real-time snapshot of institutional performance and the strategic enhancements driving progress at the University.

IMPLEMENTATION PLAN/DATE

Initiatives are ongoing. The key metrics reported will be finalized in Spring 2026 as part of the State University System's annual accountability planning process.

1. Key metrics in progress



Key metrics in progress

- Freshmen retention rate (full-time first-time-in-college students)
 - ▲ Up 2.5 percentage points over this time last year pushing for a strong finish this summer
 - Retention rate of 2024 cohort hit 80% in May (earliest point in FAU history)
- 4-year graduation rate (full-time first-time-in-college students)
 - ▲ Up 4 percentage points over this time last year pushing for a strong finish this summer
 - Graduation rate of 2021 cohort hit 50% by end of Spring (earliest point in FAU history)
- 6-year graduation rate (full-time and part-time Pell-eligible students)
 - ▲ Up 1 percentage point over this time last year
 - Poised for a bump in 2026, as 2020 cohort is tracking 3 percentage points ahead
- 3-year graduation rate (full-time and part-time Florida College System AA students)
 - ▲ Up 1.5 percentage points over this time last year



2. Florida Atlantic's student success strategy



Cross-functional teams for driving continuous improvement

Al-driven analytics for proactive care and maximized resources



Focus levels - forecast likelihood of success

- Manage student populations
 - Steer custom content to social media
 - Prioritize one-on-one time with advisors versus self-guided sessions and group advising
- Launch proactive interventions
 - Request early alert feedback from instructors
 - Target students for tutoring and mentoring
- Support individual students
 - Offer incentive-based scholarships to accelerate those who are predicted to benefit the most
 - Connect students with academic coaching before they experience academic difficulty
