Intramural Sports Forfeit Deposit FAU Campus Recreation

Background Information

- During the 2009-2010 academic year, an average of 22% of games were forfeited per sport, and an average of \$28.12 is lost per game on officials' and supervisors' wages.
 - \$32.00 lost on games which require 3 officials per game: flag football, basketball, outdoor soccer
 - \$24.25 lost on games which require 2 officials per game: indoor soccer, 4-on-4 flag football, volleyball
 - When a team forfeits once, the Graduate Assistant of Intramural Sports calls the team captain to see if they plan on returning to the league. After a 2nd forfeit, a team is removed from the league.
- In Fall 2009 and Spring 2010 combined, 183 out of 807 scheduled games were forfeited in league sports and \$5,119.75 was lost.
- Students are currently not deterred from forfeiting an Intramural Sports contest. The possibility of not qualifying for playoffs is not enough.

^{*}The amount of the forfeit fee depends on the sport. For example, a league sport such as basketball or flag football results in a higher price as opposed to a one-day tournament such as dodgeball or kickball.

Intramural Sports Forfeit Deposit Options

- At the last Campus Recreation Advisory Board meeting, a forfeit fee was proposed. Basic points from the proposed forfeit fee include:
 - 1. To register for a league, a team captain (or another student on the team) would input their credit or debit card information through FAU Touchnet Marketplace and place \$30 on hold
 - 2. If a team forfeits, the \$30 would be charged to the credit or debit card on file
 - 3. If a team forfeits a second time, team would be removed from the league
 - 4. Credit cards will not be charged if a team does not forfeit
- From this proposed forfeit fee process, one major concern arose: how do we accommodate students who do not have a credit or debit card?
- Campus Recreation investigated the feasibility of using Owl Bucks as a form of payment for the forfeit deposit. Basic points from the Owl Bucks option include:
 - 1. To register for a league, a team captain (or another student on the team) would acknowledge the forfeit fee and payment requirement
 - 2. If a team forfeits, Campus Recreation would locate the team captain & set a deadline for payment of the fee. Campus Recreation cannot assess fee on their own-a student must come in to pay
 - Note: Fees and holds cannot be placed directly on student accounts for 'optional' activities

Proposed Forfeit Deposit Process

Captain purchases an Intramural Sports Forfeit Fee Deposit on FAU Marketplace using a credit card; \$30 is on hold. Charges will not be applied to account unless team forfeits.



If team forfeits once, a \$30 charge is assessed to account.

Team will be contacted by IM Sports Staff and must confirm their intention to participate in the league.



If a team forfeits again, they will be removed from the league. Their account will not be charged a second time.



If team does not forfeit throughout season, IM Sports Forfeit Deposit will be cleared within one week following Championship Game.
