OFFICE OF ASSESSMENT, ACCREDITATION AND ANALYTICS DID YOU KNOW?

Florida House Bill 875 represents the most comprehensive reform of educator preparation in recent years. This legislation fundamentally restructures how Florida prepares, certifies, and supports teachers through enhanced clinical experiences, standardized curricula, revised certification pathways, and a complete overhaul of the Florida Educator Accomplished Practices (FEAPs).

For teacher preparation programs, this means significant changes to program structure, curriculum design, clinical partnerships, and assessment approaches—all to be implemented on an aggressive timeline culminating in July 2029.

Florida Educator Accomplished Practices (FEAP) Revision

Current FEAPs (Last revised 2023):

- Six practices: Instructional Design & Lesson Planning, Learning Environment,
 Instructional Delivery & Facilitation, Assessment, Continuous Professional Improvement,
 Professional Responsibility & Ethical Conduct
- Foundation for teacher prep programs, certification requirements, and evaluation systems

FEAP Revision Timeline:

September 1, 2025: DOE establishes workgroup (representatives from teacher prep programs, districts, classroom teachers, stakeholders)

July 1, 2026: Workgroup will complete FEAP revision; DOE will submit revised FEAPs to Governor and Legislature

August 1, 2026: State Board of Education will consider and adopt revised FEAPs

July 1, 2027: DOE will begin development of Teacher Excellence Examination aligned with revised FEAPs

After SBE adoption: DOE will submit implementation plan for aligning all programs to revised FEAPs

Note on the Florida Teacher Excellence Examination: The Teacher Excellence Examination is being developed as a formative assessment tool to measure program effectiveness and educator readiness for professional certification. This examination will align with the revised Florida Educator Accomplished Practices and serve as a critical indicator of how well teacher preparation programs are preparing candidates for classroom success.

Mandatory Uniform Core Curricula

Revised EDF 2005 to include Cognitive Science of Learning

New Course - Classroom Management and High-Impact Instructional Strategies

Programs must align with new Florida Educator Accomplished Practices (FEAPs) to be revised by workgroup

Curriculum restrictions: Cannot include identity politics or theories about systemic inequities in U.S. institutions

Knowledge-rich curricula emphasis required

School Counseling Pathway Changes

Reduced Internship Hours for Experienced Teachers: Internship requirement reduced from 600 hours to 300 hours for classroom teachers with 5 years of teaching experience and three most recent evaluations rated "effective" or "highly effective"
