Dedicated to providing research training to Florida Atlantic's undergraduate and graduate students, van Zelst currently oversees four students comprising volunteers, interns and graduate research assistants. These students are learning how to utilize EEG instrumentation, speech assessment and acoustic analyses to work directly with participants. Researchers from Florida Atlantic University and Hanyang University in Seoul, South Korea, examined how perceived AI service quality influences

retail employees' innovation, job fit and job satisfaction. The study looked at system-related factors such as reliability and transparency, as well as interaction-related aspects such as responsiveness and empathy. Researchers also explored the moderating role of Al adaptability, a key feature that allows AI systems to adjust their behavior based on user needs, for its potential to enhance service quality. "Empathy in AI fosters trust and deeper connections, encouraging employees to engage in innovative behavior by making them feel supported," said Sangbeak Ye, Ph.D., co-author and an associate professor in the Department of Educational Leadership and Research
