THE PROGRAM

The MASTER'S DEGREE in CURRICULUM & INSTRUCTION is a fully online degree that allows students to earn a 36-credit degree. Students may select an area of concentration that can be tailored to specific interests. This degree is designed for certified teachers, as well as other professionals not seeking teacher certification.

CONCENTRATION (Choose one) - 15 credits

TESOL AND BILINGUAL EDUCATION

Fully Online - Five courses in methods, curriculum and assessment strategies in TESOL and Bilingual Education. **MULTICULTURAL EDUCATION**

Fully Online - Five courses in foundations of multicultural education, global education, and diverse perspectives in education.

INTERDISCIPLINARY EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION

Fully Online - Five courses in principles, assessment, and methods in early childhood education.

SPECIFIC CONTENT AREA

Hybrid - Art, English/Language Arts, Mathematics, Reading, Science and Social Science. Courses selected according to teaching licensing area and approved by faculty advisor.

INDIVIDUAL CONCENTRATION

Designed and approved by Faculty Advisor and may include a focus in elementary education, instructional technology, or gifted education.

••• SUBMIT

Application will require applicant to submit:

- Official transcripts including all undergraduate coursework and evidence of bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university (3.0 GPA required)
- Personal Statement outlining interest in the program
- Resume
- Two letters of recommendation that highlight the candidate's academic potential
- Any additional requirements for the degree for which you are applying that are listed on the application

After your application is completed, it will be forwarded to the Department of Curriculum & Instruction for a decision.
