Master's Degree (M.Ed.) in Curriculum and Instruction *Program Description*

The **Master's Degree in Curriculum and Instruction** requires 36-semester hours (21 graduate hours in curriculum and instruction and 15 graduate hours in your selected area of specialization). This degree is designed for already certified teachers and other professionals, who are *not* seeking teacher certification. Areas of specialization include: Multicultural Education (fully online), TESOL and Bilingual Education (fully online), Early Childhood Education, a variety of specific content areas (listed below), and an Individualized Concentration tailored to meet your needs and interests. Prospective students can take up to 1/3 of the credits in this program as a non-degree seeking students before being officially admitted.

In addition, you must submit the following documentation to the Graduate College utilizing GradCas, upon which departmental approval will be contingent:

- 1) A bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university.
- 2) Official transcripts of all undergraduate and graduate coursework (undergraduate GPA of 3.0 required for the last 60 credit hours of upper division coursework).
- 3) Additional international student requirements may apply.
- 4) Personal statement specifying area of concentration (if known), reason for applying to the program and your professional goals.
- 5) Resume
- 6) Two **signed letters of recommendation**, that highlight the candidate's academic potential from a previous professor, employer or colleague (letters **MUST** be on official company/school letterhead).
- 7) Evidence of professional certification or temporary certification, if applicable.

All College of Education Programs are approved by the Florida Department of Education and the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP) previously NCATE. Please keep and consult the Florida Atlantic University catalog from the semester that you were admitted to the program, for more details regarding your program.
