The **MASTER'S DEGREE in ELEMENTARY EDUCATION WITH ESOL PLUS CERTIFICATION** prepares students for a career in teaching while earning a master's degree. Upon program completion, which includes student teaching, the student will be eligible for Florida Professional Certification.

How to **APPLY**

APPLICATION

To be considered for admission into masters programs in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction, applicants must complete a **graduate application** online through the Graduate College at <https://www.fau.edu/graduate>

SUBMIT

Application will require applicant to submit:

- Official transcripts including all undergraduate coursework and evidence of bachelor's degree from a regionally accredited college or university (3.0 GPA required)
- Personal Statement outlining interest in the program
- Resume
- Two letters of recommendation that highlight the candidate's academic potential
- Any additional requirements for the degree for which you are applying that are listed on the application

After your application is completed, it will be forwarded to the Department of Curriculum & Instruction for a decision.
