# **SECONDARY EDUCATION**



THE PROGRAMS

The **Bachelor's Degree in Secondary Education** (Biology, Chemistry, Physics, English, Mathematics and Social Studies) are hybrid (online and face-to-face classes) programs designed to prepare professionals to teach 6<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade. The degree program is comprised of engaging coursework, which students are then able to put into practice immediately during fieldwork and student teaching in local middle and high schools. Upon successful completion of required coursework and state exams, program completers will be eligible to apply for a Florida professional teaching certificate in their designated content area, allowing them to teach in any secondary classroom.

## **APPLICANTS**

Applicants must first apply to FAU as a First year/freshman (applying immediately after high school) or transfer student (already earned 12 or more college credits after graduation; earned an Associates degree, or seeking a 2nd Bachelor's).
