Abstract

Virtual education can be rewarding yet challenging for both students and teachers. The dramatic shift to virtual education may have a differential impact on some students. For students with significant cognitive disabilities, virtual education may require some unique features to ensure educational success. This presentation will describe the features of effective virtual educational experiences for students with significant cognitive disabilities, including: (a) structuring academic activities, (b) engaging students, (c) providing accommodations, and (d) ethical and legal implications of teaching in the virtual platform.
