Abstract

Choice-making is fundamental to a quality life. The ability to choose (e.g., food, clothing, residence, employment, relationships)-reflect only a few of the choices that contribute to a rich life. Yet, individuals with intellectual disabilities, are often not treated with the dignity and respect warranted, often because they are assumed incompetent. In spite of this, there is a rich literature on what choice-making should be and how it may be used to promote positive behavior, leading to greater incision and autonomy. In this session, participants will learn the nature of choice-making, why/how individuals with intellectual disabilities have been denied the right to make choices about intimate relationships or parenting, and how teaching choice-making can help improve and enrich the lives of individuals with intellectual disabilities.
