Abstract

Students with severe cognitive disabilities have attended public schools for decades, but the policies designed to promote their education are riddled with inconsistencies making for a less than effective education. Yet, one of the pillars of public education in the United States (U.S.) is a belief in education for all. Does everyone deserve an education? In this presentation, several issues surrounding education for students with severe cognitive disabilities will be explored: (a) public education values in the United States, (b) knowledge and skills taught in public schools, (c) who is taught in public schools, and (d) viability of special education in public schools designed for students with severe cognitive disability.
