CALL FOR PROPOSALS

The COE Student Achievement Council is pleased to announce the 12th Annual Student Research Symposium, and welcomes proposals for papers and posters from all COE undergraduate and graduate students. Topics related to all programs in the college that are congruent with the theme “Changing Lives: Research that Matters” are welcome. The symposium will feature a keynote speaker, oral and multimedia presentations, and poster sessions.

Guidelines for Submitting Proposals

Proposals may include proposed research, literature reviews, conceptual or theoretical pieces, thesis or dissertation research, action research or capstone project papers, and any other original scholarly work. Research that has been previously published must indicate so on the proposal form. All presentations and posters must conform to the APA Style Manual, 6th Edition and must include references. **Consultation with faculty is highly recommended. This is a competitive and selective process and not all proposals will be accepted.** Group or individual submissions are welcome. Students whose proposals are accepted for presentation or poster session **must** attend the symposium.

Proposals for presentations or poster sessions must include the following:

- A completed proposal submission form completed on SurveyMonkey. Please note: A/V equipment will be available for presentations. The SAC Symposium Committee reserves the right to determine the number of presentations accepted. Two poster sessions will share each table and up to two chairs. Poster materials and boards are not provided. **YOU MAY NOT GET YOUR FIRST CHOICE OF FORMAT BASED ON THE NUMBER/TYPE OF SUBMISSIONS. If selected, you will present EITHER a PowerPoint or a Poster.**
- A 400-word maximum, *well-written* abstract that includes: a brief description of the topic, methodology, current stage of research, and significance to the study and/or practice of education or another program within the College of Education. The abstract may be typed directly into the SurveyMonkey submission form. We recommend your professor assist you with writing a good abstract.

Submission Deadline: Friday, September 28, 2012 by 11:59 p.m. EST. Late Submissions will not be accepted.
