Acknowledgment of Immigration Responsibilities for J-1 Students

During your stay in the U.S. with a DS-2019 issued by Florida Atlantic University, the International Student and Scholar Services Office (ISSS) is responsible for maintaining your electronic J-1 immigration record in the Student Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS). Advisors at ISSS are here to assist you in understanding your benefits and responsibilities as a J-1 student. It is your responsibility to maintain valid J-1 status and to comply with all immigration regulations pertaining to your visa status while pursuing your educational objectives. Violating the terms of your J-1 status can have serious academic and personal consequences.

J-1 Student Immigration Responsibilities

- Provide the ISSS Office with updated copies of your immigration documents.
- Possess a valid passport, DS-2019, and I-94 card (marked J-1, D/S) at all times.
- Inform ISSS of any changes in your personal information, program of study, financial support sources, or any other information that alters the content of the I-20 document and the SEVIS record associated with the I-20.
- Report any change of address to ISSS and to BANNER (via MyFAU) within 10 days of occurrence.
- Enroll in a full course of study at all times*:
 - o Undergraduate students: 12 credit hours each academic semester (fall and spring)
 - o Graduate students: 9 credit hours each academic semester (fall and spring)
 - O Students entering FAU in the summer you must also enroll full-time during the summer term (12 credit hours for undergraduate students starting in Summer II and 6 credit hours for students starting in Summer III; 6 credits for graduate students)
- * Enrollment below full course of study may be authorized by ISSS for a specific and limited number of reasons. Students must discuss their options with ISSS prior to obtaining this authorization.
 - Maintain good academic standing and make normal progress towards completion of degree.
 - Know your DS-2019 completion date and obtain an extension from ISSS prior to the expiry date. Extensions are granted after consulting with the Office of International Programs regarding eligibility for extension.
 - Obtain travel signature and verify the validity of all your immigration documents (DS-2019, passport, visa) prior to traveling outside the U.S.
 - Obtain proper work authorization prior to engaging in any type of employment (paid or unpaid) and work within the limitations of J-1 visa status. Working without employment authorization is a serious violation of status and can result in deportation.
 - Inform ISSS of any potential changes in immigration status.
 - Seek advice from ISSS regarding immigration issues. If the questions are beyond the expertise of the ISSS staff, seek advice from an immigration attorney.
 - Update information related to your J-2 dependents.
 - Comply with the mandatory medical insurance requirement (which meets FAU, Florida Board of Governors, and U.S. Department of State guidelines) and provide proof of insurance to ISSS.

- (a) fully and properly comply with all laws and regulations of the U.S. Government, U.S. Department of State, U.S. Department of Homeland Security (**DHS**) and its immigration agencies namely: U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE), U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) and U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS), and
- (b) maintaining my legal status and ensuring that any necessary documents are forwarded to ISSS and/or appropriate immigration agency in a timely manner. Florida Atlantic University, its faculty, staff, agents or employees will not be liable to me for any difficulties I may experience as a result of failure to maintain proper legal immigration status.

I acknowledge that I received a copy of the "Immigration Responsibilities for J-1 Students" information sheet. Since it is my responsibility to maintain my legal status, I hereby release Florida Atlantic University, faculty, staff, agents or employees from any responsibility for consequences resulting from my failure to maintain proper legal immigration status.
