Weather (1)

- Florida is called the "Sunshine State" because of its warm, sunny climate.
- Average of more than 240 days of sunshine a year.
- Experience summer highs of around the 80°F (27°C) and 90°F (32 °C); and cozy winter lows of 60°F (15°C) and 70°F (21°C)






Weather (2)

- "The weather in Florida can be confusing."
- Known for having a subtropical climate.
- Wet Season (May–October): Florida's wet season brings about 68% of the state's total rainfall for the year. Showers and thunderstorms happen frequently.
- Dry season (November-April): Brings significantly less humidity, reduced precipitation, and fewer storms.
- Hurricane season runs from June 1 through November 30.
- Regardless of the season, keep a close watch on the forecast, and try downloading a storm-tracking app like Storm to get the latest info on weather.
- Tips: Umbrella and sunblock are your friends.





A Guide to Florida's Weather



- Florida is the thunderstorm capital of the United States
- Lightning is the state's leading cause of weather-related death

Weather

- April, May, & the summer months are peak periods for tornadoes
- Hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30


