September 9, 2020
Meeting Minutes

- I. Meeting called to order by GPC Chair, Christopher Beetle at 2:02 pm.
- II. No introductions were made.
- III. The minutes from the last GPC meeting on August 19th were unanimously approved.
- IV. Announcements
 - A. Chris announced that Russ Ivey will not attend today's GPC meeting but will attend a future meeting.
 - B. Chris also proposed that, due to a scheduling conflict, Registrar Brian Hodge be allowed to speak first concerning policy proposals for the Awarding of Certificates.
- V. Awarding of Certificates Policy Proposals – Brian Hodge, Registrar
 - A. There have been many requests for certificates to be awarded “retroactively”.
 - B. We need a policy in place so we are consistent in what is being told to students.
 - C. A certificate can be awarded prior to the baccalaureate degree or graduate degree, if the program allows.
 - D. A written policy would ensure that credits are being accounted for accurately.
 1. Could credits count toward more than one certificate?
 2. Liana Smith: Other SUS schools seem to lean toward one certificate only.
 3. Eric Berlatsky: Why can't a course count toward more than one certificate?
 - a. Does this make a statement about the educational quality of the institution? Not sure what the correct answer is to this question.
 4. Chris Beetle: If the course is essential to the specialization, it should count toward all certificates. Maybe required (core) courses could count to more than one, electives maybe only one.
 5. Eric: A certificate may not carry as much weight with employers as an actual degree. It's more of an indication of knowledge you acquired.
 6. Liana: Other institutions require 9 unique credits for a separate certificate.
 7. The policy says that colleges can set stricter rules than this policy states but cannot relax them further.
 8. Paul Peluso made a motion to send this forward to UGC for consideration.
 - a. Approved unanimously to move forward to UGC.
