Program Description (provide a brief description of the program, including thesis or non-thesis option)	The Leadership Studies Minor enables students to complement any major with a focus in leadership; the 16 credit hours' curriculum allows students to take 7 credit hours from foundational courses from the Higher Education Leadership Program and 9 credit hours from interdisciplinary courses. As an interdisciplinary minor, the curriculum blends with all majors, is open to all degree-seeking undergraduate students, and engages students in critical thinking in relation to three knowledge domains: Self-Awareness as a Leader, Leadership and Teams, and Leading Our World.

The Educational Leadership and Research Methodology Department has both the Leadership Studies Minor and the Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Higher Education Leadership program.

Some students that graduate with a minor in Leadership Studies are currently or aim to attend a M.Ed. in Higher Education Leadership. Having a Combined Program Leadership Studies Minor / Master of Education (M.Ed.) with Higher Education Leadership will feed into the master of Education (M.Ed.) at Florida Atlantic University.

The faculty of the Educational Leadership and Research Methodology Department support creating the combined degree program Leadership Studies Minor / Master of Education (M.Ed.) with Higher Education Leadership. This program will allow academically talented, leaders, and high achiever students from any major (e.g. Bachelor's of General Studies) and minor in Leadership Studies to pursue a Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Higher Education Leadership. The proposal for the Combined program is structured to preserve the integrity and quality of the degree.

The protocol to enroll in the pathway program is: student will take 6 – 9 credit hours of 6000 level coursework during their major (e.g. Bachelor's of General Studies) and Leadership Studies Minor program. There are currently 3 courses that are offered regularly for those students to choose from to meet this criterion. Those courses cover advanced material to enrich the undergraduate curriculum with graduate level coursework, maintaining the rigorous and pedagogical emphasis. To ensure that academically talented leaders, and high achiever students are in this Combined degree program, students must have a cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.25 or higher (FAU and transfer courses) and must meet all the admissions requirement for the Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Higher Education Leadership.

The minor in Leadership Studies is suited to prepare students for the M.Ed. in Higher Education Leadership, and it can be matched with any major. This Combined degree program will allow students in the minor Leadership Studies to have the same access to an accelerated Master of Education with any major degree program.

Combined Degree Program: Leadership Studies Minor / Master of Education (M.Ed.) with Higher Education Leadership

The Leadership Studies Minor / Master of Education (M.Ed.) with Higher Education Leadership allows all FAU undergraduate students with any major and a Leadership Studies Minor the opportunity to complete the Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Higher Education Leadership in less time than the traditional Master in Education program. This Combined program is intended for academically talented leaders, and high achiever students.

Students must declare any major (e.g. Bachelor's of General Studies), and the Leadership Studies Minor. Students must apply for the combined degree program by the end of their junior year. Once a student is admitted to the combined degree program, the student can take up to 9 credit hours of approved graduate-level courses. Those courses may be taken and count toward both the minor in Leadership Studies Minor and the Master's in Higher Education Leadership. Students must meet the following to fulfill the requirements of the Combined degree program:

- Student has met the minimum 120 credit hours overall for any major (e.g. Bachelor's of General Studies),
- Student has completed and met the requirements of taking 7 credit hours of the Leadership Studies Minor, and
- Student has taken a minimum of 36 credit hours (6000 level or higher) for the M.Ed. in Higher education.

The Combined degree program is 136 credit hours; 120 for the undergraduate degree (e.g. Bachelor's of General Studies) and 36 for the M.Ed. in Higher Education Leadership degree. Students complete their undergraduate degree first, taking no more than 6 – 9 credit hours of graduate coursework in their senior year. The 6 – 9 credit hours will be used to satisfy both degree programs of study.

To be eligible for the Combined Leadership Studies Minor / Master of Education (M.Ed.) with Higher Education Leadership, student applicants must:

- 1. Have a cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.25 or higher (FAU and transfer courses): and
- 2. Meet all the admissions requirement for the Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Higher Education Leadership.
