Masters of Education in Elementary Education with ESOL plus Certification Proposed changes and rationale

The faculty of the department of Curriculum and Instruction are requesting to modify the admission requirements for the Masters in Elementary Education with ESOL plus Certification. This change comes as a result of the FAU Graduate College's waiving of the GRE requirements continuing through 2022 due to the COVID-19 challenges facing graduate applicants. In accordance with this exemption, our department has accepted candidates into this graduate program resulting in applicants demonstrating the ability to complete graduate level courses successfully without having taken the Graduate Record Examination and showing significant program growth. Additionally, we want to standardize admission requirements for all our master's degree programs in our newly merged department (previously CCEI and Teaching & Learning) as well as to better serve the education community in response to the critical teacher shortages occurring locally and nationally. These proposed changes would make the degree more accessible to all applicants, allow us to remain competitive with other local and national institutions offering a similar degree program, and offer an increased number of students within the critical shortage areas the opportunity to pursue graduate education. If this change is approved, applicants will be required to have a 3.0 cumulative GPA, submit a transcript, personal statement, two letters of recommendation (optional) and resume. Students would no longer be required to submit a GRE score. If the change is approved, it would necessitate a change in the university catalog to update the change in admission graduate requirements to this degree.

Proposed admission deadline change for new graduate students: Fall admittance by June 1st, Spring admittance by Oct. 1st, and Summer admittance by March 1st. Students with special circumstances requesting late admittance into a specific semester will be considered by the department. This proposed change would allow for increased efficiency with new student registration by better aligning to registration deadlines.

Applicants for graduate initial certification teacher preparation programs in the Department of Teaching and Learning, including Elementary Education (K-6), K-12 and Secondary Education (6-12), must-present passing scores on all sections of the General Knowledge Test.

A maximum of one-third of the total graduate credits taken at FAU as a non-degree student may be applied to the degree program, if approved by the advisor. Up to 6 credits of non-degree program transfer courses may be accepted from other universities at the discretion of the advisor and/or committee.

Master of Education (M.Ed.)

The Master of Education degree is offered with a major in the following areas: Curriculum and Instruction plus K-12 or Secondary Certification (6-12), Educational Psychology, Elementary Education, Elementary Education with ESOL plus Certification, Environmental Education, Instructional Technology, Reading Education and Secondary Education plus Certification. Certificates in Environmental Education, Instructional Design and K-12 Online Teaching are also available.

Applicants for graduate initial certification teacher preparation programs in the Department of Teaching and Learning, including Elementary Education (K-6), K-12, and Secondary Education (6-12), must present passing scores on all four sections of the General Knowledge Test.

A maximum of one-third of the total graduate credits taken at FAU as a non-degree student may be applied to the degree program, if approved by the advisor. Up to 6 credits of non-degree transfer courses may be accepted from other universities at the discretion of the advisor and/or the committee.

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The additional **program change removing the catalog language** that requires "passing scores on all four sections of the General Knowledge Test" in the Masters in Elem Ed plus certification program is requested due to changes in the state statute. According to state statute 1004.4, a candidate will meet the GK requirement upon graduation from an approved Master's program.

Master of Education with Major in Elementary Education with ESOL plus Certification

The master's degree (M.Ed.) in Elementary Education with ESOL plus Certification Program provides preparation for a new career in teaching. The program is designed for students who already have a bachelor's degree and intend to become elementary school teachers in grades K-6. Upon completion of the CAEP-approved program, which includes student teaching, the student should be eligible for both Florida certification and a master's degree in Elementary Education. Students should be aware that no more than one-third of the credits in this program can be taken as non-degree-seeking before official admission.

Admission Requirements

To be admitted to the M.Ed. in Elementary Education with ESOL plus Certification Program, students must complete the graduate application and provide documentation showing that they:

- 1. Have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university;

- 34. <u>Personal Statement</u>; Have passing scores on all four sections of the General Knowledge sections of the FTCE. There are no exceptions or waivers to this General Knowledge requirement. All University and departmental admission requirements apply.
