Masters of Reading Education Proposed Changes and Rationale

The faculty of the department of Curriculum and Instruction are requesting to modify the admission requirements for the Masters in Reading Education. This change comes as a result of the FAU Graduate College's waiving of the GRE requirements continuing through 2022 due to the COVID-19 challenges facing graduate applicants. In accordance with this exemption, our department has accepted candidates into this graduate program resulting in applicants demonstrating the ability to complete graduate level courses successfully without having taken the Graduate Record Examination and showing significant program growth. Additionally, we want to standardize admission requirements for all our master's degree programs in our newly merged department (previously CCEI and Teaching & Learning) as well as to better serve the education community in response to the critical teacher shortages occurring locally and nationally. These proposed changes would make the degree more accessible to all applicants, allow us to remain competitive with other local and national institutions offering a similar degree program, and offer an increased number of students within the critical shortage areas the opportunity to pursue graduate education. If this change is approved, applicants will be required to have a 3.0 cumulative GPA, submit a transcript, personal statement, two letters of recommendation (optional) and resume. Students would no longer be required to submit a GRE score. If the change is approved, it would necessitate a change in the university catalog to update the change in admission graduate requirements to this degree.

Proposed admission deadline change for new graduate students: Fall admittance by June 1st, Spring admittance by Oct. 1st, and Summer admittance by March 1st. Students with special circumstances requesting late admittance into a specific semester will be considered by the department. This proposed change would allow for increased efficiency with new student registration by better aligning to registration deadlines.

The information provided below is intended to seek questions/comments and ultimately to ensure that none of these changes pose a conflict to your programs. Please respond with a question or comment, if necessary. If not, please tell me that there is no conflict, allowing the department to move these changes forward. Thank you.

The faculty of the Department of Curriculum and Instruction request four changes to our Master's programs.

Change # 1: modification to admission criteria and application deadlines in the following programs:

- Elementary Education
- Elementary Education plus Certification
- Secondary Education plus Certification
- Educational Psychology
- Reading Education
- Instructional Technology
- Environmental Education
- Curriculum and Instruction (application deadline only)

Proposed Admission Changes

Standardize admission requirements for all our master's degree programs in our newly merged department (previously CCEI and Teaching & Learning).

Admission Criteria

• Remove GRE requirement

- 3.0 cumulative GPA
- submit a transcript
- personal statement
- resume
- two letters of recommendation (optional)

Rationale

Our department has accepted more candidates, as a result of the Graduate Records Examination (GRE) waiver, leading to significant program growth. These applicants have demonstrated the ability to complete graduate level courses successfully without having taken the GRE. These proposed changes will make the programs more accessible to all applicants and allow us to remain competitive with other local and national institutions offering similar degree programs.

Admission Deadlines

- Fall admittance by June 1st
- Spring admittance by Oct. 1st
- Summer admittance by March 1st.
- Students with special circumstances requesting late admittance into a specific semester will be considered by the department

Rationale

This proposed change will allow for increased efficiency with new student registration by better aligning to registration deadlines. If these changes are approved, it would necessitate a change in the university catalog to reflect the new graduate admission requirements and acceptance dates See the attached document for the current catalog language and the new proposed changes.

Change #2: remove catalog language that requires passing the General Knowledge exam Remove the catalog language that requires "passing scores on all four sections of the General Knowledge sections of the FTCE" in the Masters in Elem Ed plus certification program. According to state statute 1004.4, a candidate will meet the GK requirement upon graduation from an approved Master's program.

Change #3: add/delete courses from master's programs in three programs.

- Elementary Education with ESOL plus certification
- Secondary Education with ESOL plus certification
- Reading Education

Proposed Change

Course changes in programs of study for the Master's degree in Elementary Education with ESOL plus certification and the Master's degree in Secondary Education with ESOL plus certification, to include removal of Educational Statistics STA 6113 and Educational Research EDF 6481.

Rationale

Updated state policy changes (House Bill 7011) that requires candidates entering a teacher preparation programs in the 2022-2023, academic year and earning certification in a coverage areas identified in section 1012.585(3)(f), Florida Statutes, must successfully complete all competencies for a reading endorsement. The addition of these RED courses created

redundancies in covering FEAPs for accreditation, allowing for removal of courses to be in compliance with accrediting bodies.

- Replacement of undergraduate courses on previous program sheets with graduate counterparts.
- Removal of courses not required through state certification.

The removal of these courses allows the department to make the program more streamlined. This is essential to make the program competitive with other programs in the FL SUS and outside of the state. Ultimately, these changes will make the programs more attractive to those seeking certification programs

Change #4: changes to the program of study in the Masters in Reading Education. *Proposed Changes*

- Removal of some prerequisite courses to allow students more flexibility in course sequencing throughout the program. This only applies to RED prerequisites.
- Updating undergraduate courses to graduate options.
- Updated elective offerings to reflect current course offerings in the field of reading/literacy.

Rationale

These changes will ensure that the program is in line with FL Department of Education requirements. These changes will also streamline the program, meaning more accessibility for future students.
