 Please explain the requested change(s) and offer rationale below or on an attachment. We would like to replace EDP 6944 (Field Project in Educational Psychology) with EDP 6218 (Motivational Theories in Educational Psychology) as a core requirement in the Master's in Educational Psychology. This course offers students the opportunity to extend knowledge in motivational theory (a core area in the Educational Psychology discipline and often a course requirement in Educational Psychology graduate programs elsewhere). EDP 6218 also allows students a similar experience in pursuing an individualized writing project in an area of their interest under the guidance of a faculty member in Educational Psychology. The former course, EDP 6944, is geared to only those in the Educational Psychology master's, and is not marketable as an elective. Because of this, it is continually in danger of not meeting minimum course enrollment criteria and being canceled. This creates a problem for the graduation trajectory for those enrolled in the Master's in Educational Psychology who need it as a required course. In the interim, EDP 6944 (Field Project in Educational Psychology) can remain as an approved elective should the course be offered on a more intermittent basis in the future with increased enrollment in the degree. We also are omitting EDM 6235 (Middle School Curriculum) from our list of approved electives. It is our understanding this course is inactive and being removed from the list of available offerings from the department. All courses discussed here are offered by the Department of Teaching and Learning.

b. GRE score for examinations taken after August 1, 2011: 154 (verbal) and 144 (quantitative).

c. GRE scores for examinations taken before August 1, 2011: a minimum combined score 1000 (verbal and quantitative).

Both transcripts and GRE are required.
