#### STATEMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

Person is unique and irreducible, dynamically interconnected with others and the environment in caring relationships. The nature of being human is to be caring. Humans choose values that give meaning to living and cahance well-being. Well-being is creating and living the meaning of life. Persons are nurtured in their wholeness and well-being through caring relationships.

Beliefs about learning and environments that foster learning are grounded in our view of person, the nature of nursing and amoning knowledge and the mission of the University. Learning involves the lifetong creation of understanding through the integration of knowledge within a context of value and accaning. A supportive covironment for learning is a caring cavironment. A caring cavironment is one in which all aspects of the person are respected, nurtured and eclebrated. The learning environment supports faculty-student relationships that honor and value the contributions of all and the shered learning and growth.
