BACKGROUND:

International applicants seeking admission to Florida Atlantic University (FAU) must demonstrate adequate English language proficiency in compliance with Board of Governors Regulation 6.009 (Admission of International Students to State University System). The regulation requires that all methods for determining English language proficiency be clearly outlined in university regulations, and allows the university to determine mechanisms for evaluating English language proficiency.

APPLICABILITY:

This policy applies to the review of graduate degree program applications from international applicants and other applicants who are non-native speakers of English.

DEFINITIONS:

Non-Native English Speaker: An applicant whose native language is not English, or for whom English was not the language of instruction from the primary grades.

<u>International Applicant</u>: International student who seeks admission to the university and who requires a student visa or other non-immigrant temporary immigration status.

<u>English Language-Medium Countries</u>: Countries where English is the native language for a majority of the population, and/or where full curriculum instruction in English begins in the primary grades.

<u>Recognized Post-Secondary Institution</u>: Post-secondary institution equivalent to a regionally accredited institution in the U.S.

POLICY STATEMENT

Applicants who are non-native speakers of English must demonstrate adequate English language proficiency to be considered for admission into a degree program. English language proficiency will be assessed through one of the following methods:

- University-approved standardized English language proficiency tests commonly
 used in U.S. university admissions (including, but not limited to, TOEFL and IELTS)
 as posted on the Graduate College and graduate academic departments websites.
- Successful completion of Level VI in the Academic Track of the Intensive English Institute at FAU

Non-native English speaking applicants <u>are not required</u> to submit proof of English language proficiency if they meet the following criteria:

 Completion of 60+ post-secondary credits or an associate degree or higher (prior to matriculation) from a U.S. regionally accredited postsecondary institution or from a recognized post-secondary institution abroad with full curriculum of instruction in English

PROCEDURES

The Graduate College and the graduate academic departments must publish the minimum English language proficiency requirements, including the minimum scores for any standardized language proficiency tests such as TOEFL or IELTS on their websites.

The Center for Global Engagement, in consultation with the Graduate College, is responsible for selection of standardized English language proficiency tests that can be used for admission to degree programs. Selection must be consistent with existing B.O.G. regulations, university admission standards, and current practices in the field of international admissions.
