Admission Requirements

All program applicants must have an undergraduate grade point average of 3.0 in the last 60 credits and Graduate Record Exam (GRE) scores of 150 (verbal) and 149 (quantitative), or a quantitative-verbal combined score of 1000 on the original GRE general exam (scores are valid for five years). These are minimum requirements that are necessary for consideration for admission to the program. Higher scores will increase applicants' chances for admission. Prerequisites of the master's degree program include one year each of biology, chemistry and physics; one semester each of biochemistry and organic chemistry; and at least two upper-division biology classes. A personal statement explaining career goals is required as well as three letters of recommendation, at least two of which must be from former professors.
