- **IV.** All agenda items recommended by the GPC were unanimously approved by UGC to move forward to the Steering meeting on November 21, 2019.
- V. Discussion of Catalog Changes/Updates
  - a. Brian Hodge, Registrar, shared that generally changes to the Catalog are to wording NOT program requirements.
    - i. A situation came up recently where a program was making changes to the order and/or positioning of courses within a program ie: Core course vs. electives.
  - b. Paul Peluso, UGC Chair, questioned whether the process could be streamlined somewhat on order to not "bog down" the Senate.
    - i. Can certain "changes" be handled within the individual colleges without the need to go through the GPC/UGC process?
    - ii. Adam Bradford, A&L, feels that it would be better to err on the side of being overly cautious.
    - iii. It was brought to the Committee's attention that the *Procedure for Approving Graduate Program Catalog Changes*, posted on the UGC page of the Graduate College Webpage, does address this.
    - iv. Chris Beetle, Science, feels the best way to not "bog down" the workings of the Senate is to get more items on the Consent Agenda as opposed to the Action Agenda. The default should be the Consent Agenda, not the Action Agenda. Let Steering or the Senate pull items they believe require more and deeper discussion.
  - c. The following motion was made: Items approved by the UGC shall be placed on a Consent Agenda for consideration by the UFS, unless the UGC votes to move one or more items to an Action Agenda. Each item moved to an Action Agenda shall be accompanied by a brief summary of the UGC's reasons for believing deliberation by the full UFS is warranted.

i. The motion was seconded and approved unanimously by the UGC to go on the UFS agenda as an action item.

# VI. Discussion of Research Space Assignment Policy

- a. Paul Peluso shared this policy with the UGC and recommended that UGC send this to college committees for discussion and feedback from same. This will be revisited and discussed at the next UGC meeting on December 11<sup>th</sup>.
  - i. This will be a "check-in" meeting to determine whether more time is needed for review.

## **VII.** Tuition Waiver Allocation Committee update

a. The goal of this committee is to set forth a policy that makes it transparent as to how tuition waiver funds are allocated and to find money to help fund Graduate Student Health Insurance.
