Date: August 16, 2017

The Department of Music proposes the removal of the following statement that appears in the Master of Music catalog listing: Each student in the MM program must meet the College's foreign language requirement of two semesters (8 credits) of undergraduate study in the same foreign language OR complete a graduate-level Reading for Research course (FRE/GER/SPN) OR demonstrate proficiency. Any course work taken to fulfill the requirement does not count toward the Master of Music degree.

The language requirement is not a standard required by the National Association of Schools of Music for Master of Music degrees. This statement seems to be an old artifact from the Master of Arts degree listing that was never updated in several catalog revisions. The Department has verified with the Dorothy F. Schmidt College of Arts and Letters that this is not a College requirement, but departmental. Therefore, the department proposes to remove this statement from the catalog.
