Course Description: This course encompasses clinical practice components and completion of a final practice based project. Projects will reflect the DNP designing systems of care for an aging population within a caring framework. In designated practice setting, the program requires a minimum of 250 clinical hours across 2 semesters. Course will be repeated at least once to meet overall program requirements.

Objectives: 1. Explore and develop innovative images of nursing.

- a. Implement the capstone project in the chosen healthcare site
- b. Apply knowledge of DNP role to the practice area.
- c. Evaluate the effectiveness of the DNP role in practice
- 2. Advance the discipline of nursing through practice and research.
 - a. Articulate the effectiveness of the Capstone Project as contributing to nursing knowledge and broader application of the DNP..
 - b. Determine the overall feasibility of the application of the Capstone project to a wider population.
 - c. Determine the cost benefit ratio of the project.

- 3. Demonstrate synthesis of nursing role.
 - a. Implementation of a Capstone project to improve health care for an aging population
 - b. Appraise current knowledge of the area in which the project will take place.
 - c. Analyze how outcomes of the capstone project will translate to other areas of healthcare.
- 4. In corporate an understanding of wholeness of persons connected with others and the environment through caring.
 - a. Articulate the effects of the project outcomes on patients, families, and communities.
 - b. Creates a project for chage in healthcare that nurtures the wholeness of an aging population.
- 5. Actualize nursing as nurturing the wholeness of others through caring.
 - a. Calculate the advantages and disadvantages of the change process in healthcare today.
 - b. Construct a model for change in healthcare that benefits the idea of nursing wholeness for an aging population.

Required Texts: None

<u>Learning Methods</u>: Practice with preceptor, meetings with faculty advisor, working independently within a practice setting. This course requires a minimum of 215 practice hours.

EVALUATION METHODS

Capstone Proposal – 10% Implementation of Project – 20% Formal Evaluation of Project outcomes – 20% Final Paper – 25% Presentation of Project Outcomes – 25%

Grading for this project will constitute 6 credits over two semesters. Grades for the first semester and second semester will be based on a contract between the student and faculty advisor regarding achievements toward the final goals of the course.
