<p>Please explain the requested change(s) and offer rationale below or on an attachment.</p> <p>The College of Medicine would like to assign two grade designations (i.e., WF and WP) that already exist in Banner (see email exchange with University Registrar, Marie Clarie DeMassi) for all courses and clerkships in Year 1, Year 2, Year 3 and Year 4. We have had several students that have been granted a Withdrawal ("W") by the College of Medicine, for medical reasons supported by a physician's note, very late in a course (but did not meet the University's "WM" grade criteria) but they were actually failing the course. This loophole has allowed students to avoid receiving an Unsatisfactory ("U") grade, bypass the need to go before our Promotions Committee, and retain their "good standing" including retaining all scholarships (which require a student to successfully complete all courses in "good standing.") The "WF" (Withdrawal Failing) grade designation would allow us to indicate on the student's transcript a more accurate representation of their performance at the time of withdrawal. It would also allow us to create policies that would require a student to go before our Promotions Committee, and for the College to consider whether or not to maintain or withdraw any scholarship support. Likewise, a grade of "WP" (Withdrawal Passing) would more accurately reflect a student's performance at the time of withdrawal. All students are eligible to apply to the University for a "WM" (Withdrawal- Exceptional Circumstance) and if granted, would receive a "WM" grade. If not, a "W" would be used if the student withdrew from the course during the period after the end of Drop/Add week up through the Last Day to Drop with a "W." After that period a student who withdrew from a course would receive either a "WF" or "WP" grade.</p>

The "AU" notation carries no credit and indicates that the student registered for the course only as an auditor.

A "CR" notation indicates that the student received credit for the course by examination (see Credit by Examination later in this section).

The "NC" notation indicates no credit and only pertains to General Education Program courses and selected lower-division courses. More information on the [NC grade](#) appears below.

The "NR" notation is temporarily added to the transcript by the Registrar's Office when an instructor does not turn in a grade for a student in a particular course by the deadline for submission in the semester the course was taken. The "NR" is not a grade, and courses so marked are not included in the grade point average. When the instructor submits a grade to the Registrar's Office, the "NR" notation is replaced.

A "W" notation indicates that the student withdrew from the course during the period after the end of Drop/Add week up through the **Last Day to Drop With a "W."** Please review the [Academic Calendar](#) for specific dates. The course appears on the transcript, but no credit is awarded and the course is not included in the grade point average.

A "WF" notation indicates that the student withdrew from the course during the period after the end of Drop/Add week up through the Last Day to Drop with a "W", had a failing average at the time of withdrawal, and was not eligible for a "WM" withdrawal. The course appears on the transcript, but no credit is awarded and the course is not included in the grade point average.

A "WP" notation indicates that the student withdrew from the course during the period after the end of Drop/Add week up through the Last Day to Drop with a "W", had a passing average at the

time of withdrawal, and was not eligible for a “WM” withdrawal. The course appears on the transcript, but no credit is awarded and the course is not included in the grade point average.

The "WM" notation indicates that the student was granted an Exceptional Circumstance withdrawal.

The "ZR" notation appears next to courses that are dropped after the drop/add period. Drop retained courses are used in the calculation of [attempted hours](#). Note: The ZR notation is no longer in use, but noted here for historical purposes.

Hi Marie Claire,

Jen Caceres has asked me to coordinate a virtual meeting between you, me, her and our COM Registrar, Kimberly Stanley. We would like to discuss if it is possible to have (2) additional grade designations for the College of Medicine? Specifically, we would like to discuss a (WF) or Withdrawal/Failing grade for a student who is granted a withdrawal by the COM late in the course (but does not meet the University's ECW grade) but is failing the course and a (WP) or Withdrawal/Passing for a student who similarly is granted a withdrawal but is passing the course.

We have had several students recently who have found the loophole and are withdrawing (for medical reasons supported by a doctor's note) but only after they realize there is no way for them to pass the course but they don't meet the ECW criteria so they are receiving a (W) grade designation and we believe that a (WF) or (WP) would be a more accurate designation for residency applications, consideration of continued college scholarships, consideration by the COM promotions committee, etc.

I am cc'ing Samara and Annie to see if they can help us arrange a meeting time in the next couple of weeks to discuss this with you.
