The course appears on the transcript, but no credit is awarded and the course is not included in the grade point average.

A "WP" notation indicates that the student withdrew from the course during the period after the end of Drop/Add week up through the Last Day to Drop with a "W", had a passing average at the

time of withdrawal, and was not eligible for a "WM" withdrawal. The course appears on the transcript, but no credit is awarded and the course is not included in the grade point average.

The "WM" notation indicates that the student was granted an Exceptional Circumstance withdrawal.

Hi Marie Claire,

Jen Caceres has asked me to coordinate a virtual meeting between you, me, her and our COM Registrar, Kimberly Stanley. We would like to discuss if it is possible to have (2) additional grade designations for the College of Medicine? Specifically, we would like to discuss a (WF) or Withdrawal/Failing grade for a student who is granted a withdrawal by the COM late in the course (but does not meet the University's ECW grade) but is failing the course and a (WP) or Withdrawal/Passing for a student who similarly is granted a withdrawal but is passing the course.

We have had several students recently who have found the loophole and are withdrawing (for medical reasons supported by a doctor's note) but only after they realize there is no way for them to pass the course but they don't meet the ECW criteria so they are receiving a (W) grade designation and we believe that a (WF) or (WP) would be a more accurate designation for residency applications, consideration of continued college scholarships, consideration by the COM promotions committee, etc.

I am cc'ing Samara and Annie to see if they can help us arrange a meeting time in the next couple of weeks to discuss this with you.
