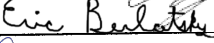

Please explain the requested change(s) and offer rationale below or on an attachment. The Department requests to eliminate the MAT degree in Political Science to use the Departmental and University resources more effectively. The Graduate Program of the Department of Political Science oversees MA in Political Science, MS in Data Science and Analytics - Society concentration. It also assists the PhD Program in Comparative Studies. Discontinuation of MAT will allow the Department to focus on existing degrees. The MAT degree in Political Science is in direct competition with our MA degree. It also competes with multiple College of Education degrees, including M. Ed. in Secondary Education, M. Ed. in Instructional Technology, M. Ed. in Educational Psychology, and Ed.S. in Curriculum and Instruction, to name a few. The MAT degree is not well-positioned to compete with these programs. The Political Science part of the degree is delivered more effectively by the MA in Political Science, while the graduate programs in the College of Education provide various substantive degrees, further diminishing the value of MAT in Political Science. The objective data supports this reasoning. In the last six years (since Fall 2017), only two students have actively pursued the MAT degree. Two additional students have been admitted to the MAT degree. However, one has officially petitioned to transfer to the MA degree, while the other applied to both MA and MAT degrees, but actively pursues only the MA degree. The MAT degree involves advising students about the courses over which the Department has limited control. Coordinating the scheduling and substance of the required courses across various Colleges is an additional logistical burden on the Department. Due to the very limited interest among students and less than justified costs to the Department, we petition to eliminate the MAT degree in Political Science.

MASTER'S PROGRAMS

POLITICAL SCIENCE MASTER OF ARTS (M.A.)

(Minimum of 30 credits required)

The Department of Political Science offers the Master of Arts degree, which requires 30 graduate credits. Students may choose from a non-thesis or thesis option to meet the requirements of the degree. The non-thesis option is designed for students who wish to specialize in an area of study by completing two seminars instead of a thesis. Those who prefer the thesis option may do so with the permission of the Director of Graduate Studies. The thesis option is designed to prepare graduates for doctoral or professional programs. All students are admitted as non-thesis students. After the completion of at least 9 but not more than 15 graduate credits, a student may apply for admission to the thesis option. The application is submitted to the graduate director. If the Graduate Committee grants thesis-option status, the student must work with the graduate director to create a thesis committee.
