Notice of Choice Regarding Program Change

Dear Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling student:

As you may know, the State of Florida recently changed its requirements regarding licensing mental health counselors. Rather than requiring 1000 hours of university supervised field placement, Florida now requires 750 hours of field placement, prior to graduation. This brings our state requirement in line with CACREP's expectations. As a result, the Clinical Rehabilitation Counseling faculty will petition the College to change our course sequence. Beginning in 2023, RCS 6805-Advanced Practicum will no longer be a part of the requirements for graduation.

As an entering CRC student, this means you have a choice. You may choose to remain in your current program of study, under the catalog in which you enrolled, and take RCS 6805 and complete 66-hour course sequence. You may also choose to move to the new course sequence, when it is approved, meaning that you would not take Advanced Practicum in Summer 2023 and complete the 63-hour course sequence. Both options meet the State of Florida 60-hour master's in counseling course requirement. It is strongly recommended that every student must meet with their faculty advisor regarding this decision. If spring 2024 is your final semester, you must make a decision prior to December 10th, 2021 to be eligible to switch to the new program of study.
