MSPE Grouping as a Candidate for Post-Graduate Training

NOTE: The College of Medicine sets a target range for the percentage of students in each Grouping, but <u>all</u> the descriptors are considered prior to final assignment into one of the groups; therefore, the Groupings should not be interpreted as a surrogate for class rank.

Grouping	Description
Exceptional	This is any candidate whose academic performance is considered to be in approximately the top 20-30% of the class, and in addition they have <i>excelled</i> in attributes** that demonstrate the highest level of physicianship throughout medical school.
Outstanding	This is any candidate whose academic performance is considered to be in approximately the top 20-30% of the class, and they have <i>consistently demonstrated</i> attributes**of physicianship throughout medical school.
	OR
	This is any candidate whose academic performance is considered to be in approximately the top 50% of the class, and in addition they have <i>excelled</i> in attributes** that demonstrate a high level of physicianship throughout medical school.
Excellent	This is any candidate whose academic performance is considered to be in approximately the top 50% of the class, and they have <i>consistently demonstrated</i> attributes**of physicianship throughout medical school.
	OR
	This is any candidate whose academic performance met expectations, and in addition they have <i>excelled</i> in attributes** that demonstrate a high level of physicianship throughout medical school.
Very Good	This is any candidate whose academic performance met expectations, and in addition they have <i>consistently demonstrated</i> attributes** of physicianship throughout medical school.
Good	This is a candidate whose academic performance met expectations, and they have demonstrated attributes** of physicianship throughout medical school.
