

Early Care & Education (BECE)


- Prepares students to work with young children from birth to age 5

Soar-in-4 Scholars Program

Success Network

- Your Success Network connects you to your FAU support system:

University Advising Services (UAS)

UAS will be your primary source for the following:

- Course advising
- Academic policies and information
- Changing or declaring majors
- Making appropriate referrals to important resources on campus
- Academic questions



Intellectual Foundations Program (IFP)



Bachelor of Arts (BA) / Bachelor of Science (BS)

- Requires completion of a language at the collegiate level
- The language credits used to satisfy this will use free elective credit in order to satisfy this requirement IF:
 - Does not have previously earned language credit (i.e. AP, IB, AICE, etc)

IMPORTANT TO NOTE:

- ☐ Foreign language is a graduation requirement for only certain majors
- □ 2 years of a language in high school = starting with
 1121 level (per the Languages and Linguistics
 Department)
- ☐ All courses are 4 credits be mindful of elective credits
- ☐ CLEP

Bachelor of Arts in Education (BAE) / Bachelor of Science in Education (BSE)

- Language has already been completed through high school credit
- Collegiate level language is <u>NOT</u> required

Foreign Language

- Arabic (ARA 1120/1121)
- Chinese (FOL 1120/1121)
- French (FRE 1120/1121)
- German (GER 1120/1121)
- Hebrew (HER 1120/1121)
- Italian (ITA 1120/1121)
- Japanese (JPN 1120/1121)
- Latin (LAT 1120/1121)
- Spanish (SPN 1120/1121)



DARS (Degree Audit)

The Degree Audit Reporting System (DARS) displays what courses you have completed, what courses you have in-progress, and which courses you need for your major.

DARS is helpful for the following:

- Determining where you are in your program
- What courses you have left to take
- How courses have transferred to FAU (if applicable)



Academic Success Resources

<u>Supplemental Instruction (SI)</u> provides students with academic support for courses.

The Center for Teaching and Learning (CTL) provides many more academic support resources and tutoring for math, writing, science, and other subjects.



Policies You Should Know Now



Withdrawal Policy (W Policy)

Undergraduate students may not withdraw (with a grade of "W" or "ZR" from more than 2 courses at the lower-division level (1000 – 2000 level courses) and from more than 3 courses at the upper division or higher level (3000 and 4000 level courses.)

Always speak with your academic advisor before making any decisions to withdraw from a course.



Withdrawal Policy (W Policy)

current Undergraduate Program Withdrawal Counts: You may not drop course(s) more than the Limitations on Number of Withdrawals policy.

Course Level	Withdrawal Limit	Current Total Withdrawals	Future Withdrawals Allowed
Lower-Division Level	2	0	2
Upper-Division Level	3	0	3



Civic Literacy

Students may complete this requirement in one of the following ways: Take a course:

- Successfully pass POS 2041: Government of the United States.
- Successfully pass AMH 2020: U.S. History since 1877.

Achieving the minimum required score on the following assessments:

- Civic Literacy Test
- Advanced Placement Government and Politics: United States
- Advanced Placement U.S. History
- CLEP American Government
