Passing grade in POS 2041, or AMH 2020	Must take Exam with passing score, or the Florida Civic Literacy Examination (FCLE)





WITHDRAWAL POLICY

- → Undergraduate students may of withdraw (with a grade of "W") from:
 - More than 2 courses at the lower-division level (1000- and 2000-level courses)
 - More than 3 courses at the upper-division or higher level (3000- and 4000-level courses)
- → ALWAYS speak with your academic advisor before making any decision to withdraw from a course.

First-Year Interest Groups (FIGS)


In a FIG, you:


