


# Understanding Your Academic Requirements





# College of Engineering & Computer Science Policies


After <u>ONE</u> unsuccessful attempt of ANY lower division math course, Math Boot Camp is Mandatory.

All College of Engineering & Computer Science students are allowed only

TWO attempts at any course.

If you are unsuccessful in completing the second attempt at the course, you may be required to select a new major.

#### More information about IDS 3949:


- The course is offered twice per semester (Full and Second Half terms).




