How does the Professional Internship course work?

IDS 3949 is a 0-4 credit course that offers students the opportunity to gain "real-world" exposure and supervised experience related to their major, specific fields of study and/or career interests. Students must secure an internship prior to enrolling in the course. An Internship Specialist can assist you with your internship search.

More information about IDS 3949:

- The course is offered twice per semester (Full and Second Half terms).
- Students can register for the course multiple times.
- The course is fully online and graded as Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory.
- The course counts toward students' degree requirements as a free elective,



 - Math sequence depends on math placement & incoming credit (& major)
- 15 to finish or 30 per year
- Withdrawal Limit
- Civic Literacy Graduation Requirement

 - Don't forget the course entry quiz




