Understanding Your Academic Requirements

- → General Education
 - → Requirements vary according to your major
 - → Foreign language required for Criminal Justice majors
 - → CCJ 2002 required general education course for Criminal Justice majors
 - → PSY 1012, SYG 1000, ECO XXXX, POS 2041 and BSC 1005 & L required general education courses for Social Work majors
 - → Math sequence depends on math placement & incoming credit
 - → MGF 1130 or MAC 1105 preferred first semester math course
 - → STA 2023 required math course for Criminal Justice and Social Work majors
- → 15 to finish or 30 per year
- → Withdrawal Limit
- → Civic Literacy Graduation Requirement

Phyllis and Harvey Sandler School of Social Work


Provides for an undergraduate education that contributes to the well-being of the communities of Florida and educates competent and compassionate social workers for entry-level practice.



- Decision Making Simulator




Criminal Justice Internship





View ranges for post-graduation earnings in a single display for quick comparison







How does the Professional Internship course work?

IDS 3949 is a 0-4 credit course that offers students the opportunity to gain "real-world" exposure and supervised experience related to their major, specific fields of study and/or career interests. Students must secure an internship prior to enrolling in the course. An Internship Specialist can assist you with your internship search.

More information about IDS 3949:

- The course is offered twice per semester (Full and Second Half terms).
- Students can register for the course multiple times.
- The course is fully online and graded as Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory.
- The course counts toward students' degree requirements as a free elective,




