

Understanding Requirements of Financial Aid

Students must turn in all missing requirements

Examples: tax documents, high school transcript, etc.

Understand terms & conditions of funds and renewal criteria

In Student's terms and conditions on MYFAU

Most federal aid requires 6 credits+ enrollment and satisfactory academic progress

Certain merit scholarships may require 12 credits enrollment, and higher GPA





Parent/Guardian Notification



- Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)
- Minors (under the age of 18) who are alleged to commit an infraction of the Student Code of Conduct, their parent/guardian will receive a copy of the Notice of Charges
- Students under the age of 21 and are found to be in violation of alcohol or drug policies, their parent/guardian will receive notification that an infraction occurred












Medical Amnesty

If a student needs medical attention due to alcohol or drug use, they are asked to call 911

Proactively calling 911 and requesting emergency services will not result in charges by the university




About FAU Police Department




The Center for Learning and Student Success (CLASS)




Practical Success Strategies Supported by Research




- Create a master calendar for the semester with all readings, assignments and exams. Don't rely on the Canvas "to-do" list.
- Download, read and save a digital hard copy of the **course syllabus**. This is your road map.
- Schedule consistent blocks of time to work on each class.
- If financially feasible, **adjust your work schedule** if it is interfering with your coursework.
- Don't casually browse course content and click through Canvas and equate that with real learning/studying.
- Introduce yourself to your professor during the first week. Keep in touch!
- Meet your classmates and form study groups.
