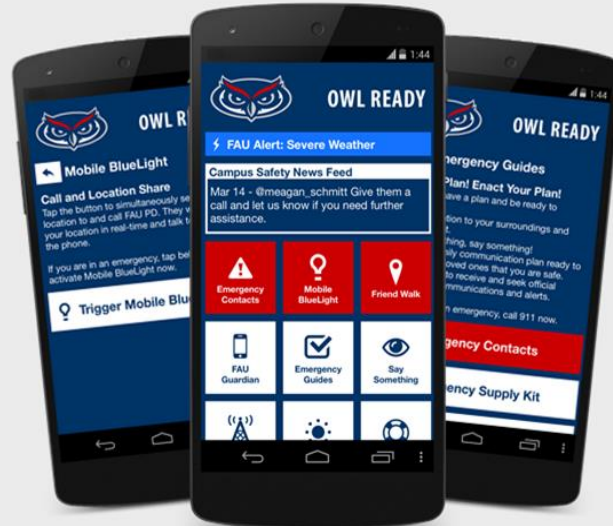

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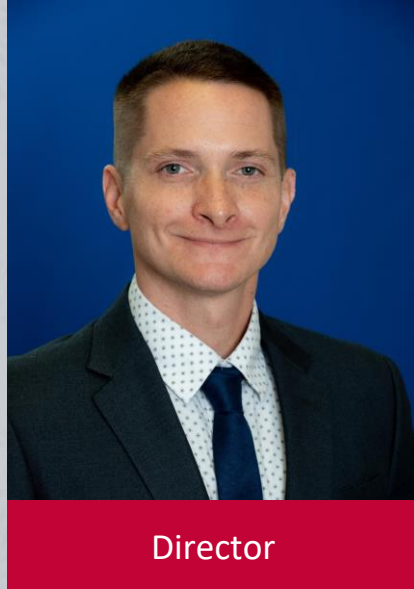

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Who we are...

Our office investigates complaints of discrimination, harassment, sexual assault and other types of sexual misconduct.



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Why are we here?

- To provide you with information on the University's policies and regulations relating to discrimination, harassment, and Title IX Matters.
- To discuss reporting and investigative processes.
- To provide information on the resources available to all students.



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FAU Prohibits Discrimination + Harassment

- All forms of discrimination or harassment based upon an individual's race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, veteran status, marital status, pregnancy and parenting status, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, or other protected status is a violation of University Regulation.
- Title IX Matters refers to discriminatory conduct that includes sexual harassment, sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking. Such conduct is expressly prohibited.

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

Campus Resources

Counseling and Psychological Services: (STUDENTS) Offers counseling (individual and group), psychiatric services, and/or referral coordination as well as prevention-oriented education and support. (CONFIDENTIAL RESOURCE)

Dean of Students Office: (STUDENTS) Provides options and information on the student conduct process and Victim Services

Office of Equity, Inclusion and Compliance: (STUDENTS/FACULTY/STAFF/THIRD PARTY VISITORS) Provides resources and investigates sexual misconduct, unlawful discrimination and harassment.

FAU Police Department: (STUDENTS/FACULTY/STAFF/THIRD PARTY VISITORS) Provides options to report a crime and referral for off campus evidence gathering.

FAU Police Department Victim Services: (STUDENTS/FACULTY/STAFF/THIRD PARTY VISITORS) Assists with restraining orders, guidance through criminal processes, and accessing community resources.

Housing and Residential Life: (STUDENTS) Provides on campus housing for students

Owls Care Health Promotion: (STUDENTS) Provides wellness services through one on one consultations, workshops, and free HIV testing. (HIV TESTING IS CONFIDENTIAL)

Student Health Services: (STUDENTS) Offers STI testing, HPV vaccine, emergency contraception and contraceptive counseling. (CONFIDENTIAL RESOURCE)

Employee Assistance Program: (FACULTY/STAFF) Horizon Behavioral Health offers employees confidential and timely assistance to members who are experiencing personal problems that may affect job performance including traumatic events. (CONFIDENTIAL RESOURCE) Login ID: Florida Atlantic University Password: EAP 1-800-865-3200.

What happens after I make a report?

Upon receiving report of discrimination or harassment, OEI ensures parties are provided with supportive measures.

OEI determines whether it has enough information to begin an investigation. If yes, OEI will follow procedure outlined in Policy 1.15.

Final investigation report submitted to appropriate administrator.

If a violation is determined in non-Title IX matters, the Administrator will issue corrective action. All Title IX Matters are referred to a hearing to determine the outcome.

Restorative Justice Focus

Conflict Resolution Skill Building

- Conflict Coaching
- Facilitated Dialogue
- Formal Mediation



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Assessment of Violations of the Code of Conduct

Partner with university departments to triage and assess immediate risks:

- Immediate measures via Dean of Students
- Safety planning
- Support of impacted individuals
- Referrals to various campus departments (CAPS, Student Health, PD)

Possible incidents addressed via the Student Code of Conduct

- Residential Community Guide
- Student of Conduct (Regulation 4.007)



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Alcohol Use

- If you are under 21, you may not use or possess alcohol.
- Hard liquor is not permitted in the residence hall.
- Alcohol may not be consumed outside of a residence hall suite.
- You may not be intoxicated in the residence hall regardless of age.

Parental Notification

- If you are under the age of 21, we will notify your family for violations of our alcohol and drug policies.



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Drugs/Controlled Substances Policy

- Use, possession, delivery to, sale of drugs or drug paraphernalia.
- Penalty – Probation, community service, educational class, and parental notification, removal from the residence halls.
- You may be arrested and/or suspended from school on a first violation depending on the incident.



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FAU is a Tobacco Free Campus

Use of all tobacco products including: cigarettes, cigars, pipes, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chewing tobacco, smokeless pouches and any other form of loose-leaf, smokeless tobacco is prohibited on all FAU campuses – includes E-Cigarettes and vapes

Includes indoor, outdoor and in vehicles on campus



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Victim Services Office

Supports student victims/survivors:

- Acting as a liaison between the victim/survivor and FAU
- Assisting with navigating campus processes
- Referrals to resources
- Class and housing accommodations
- Safety planning
- Guidance with criminal processes
