FAU Jupiter's Lifelong Learning Society Presents Author Christopher Browning

JUPITER, Fla. (October 6, 2014) - Florida Atlantic University's Lifelong Learning Society Jupiter will present a lecture by author Christopher Browning on Wednesday, Oct. 29 at 10 a.m. in the Lifelong Learning Society complex at FAU's John D. MacArthur Campus, 5353 Parkside Dr., in Jupiter.

Browning's lecture, "Hitler and The Decisions for the Final Solution," is based on his books, "Ordinary Men" and "Origins of the Final Solution" which focuses on Nazi Germany and the Holocaust. Browning has written extensively on Nazi decision and policy making in regards to the origins of the Final Solution, and the behavior and motives of various middle and lower level personnel involved in implementing Nazi Jewish policy.

Browning has been an expert witness at various trials of accused Nazi criminals in Australia, Canada and the United Kingdom, as well as in the "Holocaust Denial" trials of Ernst Zundel in Toronto (1988) and Irving vs. Lipstadt (2000) in London. In 2006, he was inducted into the American Academy of Arts and Sciences.
