Modern Urban Design & Transportation in a Historic City FAU Faculty-led Program Spring Break: March 2 - 8, 2018

Study the juxtaposition of modern London as a global financial center against its historic background which is still very much alive today as a major tourist destination. On this program students will study urban design and transportation and analyze how London is addressing the same urban planning concerns as Florida.

Eligibility and Requirements:

- Overall GPA of 2.5 or higher for undergraduate and 3.0 or higher for graduate.
- Must be enrolled in course URP 4955 or URP 5958 during the spring 2018 semester at FAU. Class meets only 2 Friday evenings before the trip to London & only 1 Friday evening after London. The London program is a fundamental requirement of the spring course.

Course Offerings:

- URP 4955: Planning Abroad (3 credits - undergraduate)
- URP 5958: Planning Abroad (3 credits - graduate)

Program Highlights:

- Urban design field work in London to evaluate public transportation first hand.
- Work with the local community (AS-L Project).
- Walking lectures discussing London urban design and transportation.

Application Deadline: Thursday, November 30, 2017 (with \$100 administrative fee)

Program Costs: \$1,245

Included:

- 5 nights lodging (double occupancy) with daily breakfast
- 2 group lunches and 2 group dinners
- Oyster transportation & London pass for certain local site & museum entrance
- CISI health insurance

Not Included: FAU tuition (in state/out of state rates apply), \$100 administrative fee, airfare, some meals, and personal spending money.
