 - a. Results of March and April events; total of over 4000 people on campus for all three events.

 - i. Attendance similar to last year.

 - iii. College showcase this year instead of breakout sessions. Provides an opportunity for students to speak to colleges.
 - d. Fall Explore events where we will target high school seniors.
 - i. Currently scheduled for October 13, 2018 from 9am-2pm. Colleges will present a portion of the program that will end around 11am.
 - e. Admissions Numbers: Goal is to enroll 3200 freshman students in Summer/Fall 2018.
 - i. 150 freshman students confirmed for Early Start so far-target is 200. If you have students who are interested in this program-direct them to the Admissions office.
 - ii. Transfer students-Goal is to keep same #. Do not want to go lower. Lower admits so far this year versus last year. Currently reviewing students applying with 90+ credit hours.
 - f. 1800 more applications than last year and 1500 more students admitted than last year. 560 more deposits versus this time last year.
 - g. May 1 is tuition deposit deadline. Will accept tuition deposits after this date if we do not reach the goal, which is 3500 tuition deposits.
