Bylaws Amendment Proposal I

Article and Section

This proposal for an amendment to the bylaws concerns Article III. General Procedures, Section C.

Current Bylaw

Article III: General Procedures

Section C: Chair elected annually at the end of each Spring semester for the upcoming academic year. Eligibility required position level of college director or associate dean of SAS or UAS.

Proposed Bylaw Amendment

Proposal to change length of service from one year to two years for the Chair and Co-Chair

- The Chair of the Academic Advising Council should have at least one year of service to Florida Atlantic University.

Proposal to broaden the terms of eligibility

- The Chair of the Academic Advising Council should hold a Director or Associate/Assistant Director.

OR

- The Chair of the Academic Advising Council can hold any position within an advising office including any academic advisor who is a voting member of the AAC.

Bylaws Amendment Proposal II

Article and Section

This proposal for an amendment to the bylaws concerns Article III. General Procedures, Section D.

Current Bylaw

Article III: General Procedures

Section D: Vice Chair elected annually at the end of each Spring semester for the upcoming academic year. Eligibility required position level of college director or associate dean of SAS or UAS.

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- The Co-Chair of the Academic Advising Council should have at least one year of service to Florida Atlantic University.

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Bylaws Amendment Proposal III

Article and Section

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Current Bylaw

Article III: General Procedures

Section C and D: Chair and Co-Chair elected annually at the end of each Spring semester.

Proposed Bylaw Amendment

Proposal to stagger the election years to non-concurrent terms for the Chair and Co-Chair

- The terms for Chair and Co-Chair will be non-concurrent. Election will be held each year, but only replacing one of the positions.

Summary of Bylaw Amendment Proposals

The voting members at the July meeting agreed the criteria needs to be the same for both the Chair and Co-Chair positions.

- Proposal to change length of service from one year to two years for the Chair and Co-Chair
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
