SECTION 4: VOLUNTEER STAFF EDUCATION

- Extra Benefits
 - o Student-athletes may not receive any benefit that is (a) not available to the public/student body and/or (b) only being made available to them because of their status as a student-athlete.
 - o Volunteer Staff should <u>not</u> provide ANY tangible item or service to a student-athlete or prospective student-athlete without first seeking approval from Compliance.
- Name, Image, Likeness (NIL)
 - An institutional staff member (paid or unpaid) <u>shall not</u> provide professional services related to a student-athletes NIL activities and a student-athlete may not compensate a coach or staff member to be involved in or assist with the activity.
 - o Institutional staff members shall not compensate or cause compensation to be directed to a current or prospective student-athlete for their NIL
- Sports Wagering
 - o An institutional staff member (paid or unpaid) may <u>not</u> place a sports wager on any sport that the NCAA conducts a championship in (or emerging sports for women) at ANY level.
 - Examples of Sports Wagering include, but are not limited to:
 - Entering an NFL fantasy draft league with an entry fee and prize pool
 - Placing a wager on the outcome of a little league game with a family member
 - Using a bookmaker or parlay card
 - Feeding institutional information to outside entities for the purpose of sports wagering
- Countable Athletically Related Activity (CARA)
 - o CARA is required practice, competition, and athletically related meetings
 - Generally, a student-athletes participation in college athletics is limited to the following:
 - In-Season:
 - 4 hours of CARA per day
 - 20 hours of CARA per week
 - 1 required day off per week
 - Out-of-Season
 - 8 hours of CARA per week
 - No more than 4 hours of skill-related instruction (practice) per week
 - 2 required days off per week
