

TOP 5 CONSIDERATIONS

Before Electing a P/F Grade for Your Spring Classes

Pass 'P' Grade

For eligible classes, a 'P' grade is equivalent to a D- or higher. A 'P' grade in an eligible course will meet prerequisite and degree requirements.

Fail 'F' Grade

An 'F' grade is similar to an 'F' grade in a standard graded course.

A 'P' grade means you earn credit for the class, but it won't change your GPA. Calculate your potential GPA when choosing the P/F option.



An 'F' grade means you will not earn any credit hours for completing the course. Also, it *will* affect your GPA.



Do not take a P/F if you are doing well in the course. If unsure, talk to your instructor.



If you plan on going on to a graduate or professional school, carefully consider your choice of the P/F option.
